Please give an overview of what you saw / did (200 words max) What were the best things about the visit? (120 words max)	During the placement my timetable was flexible, and I was encouraged to engage in all types of clinical activity including ward rounds, meetings, clinics and theatre sessions, according to what I found most useful. The team were friendly and welcoming, and encouraged me to interact with patients and assist in theatre by "scrubbing in". In total I observed more than 50 procedures, and a few of the most interesting cases included: cleft lip and/or palate repair, total cranial vault reconstruction, syndactyly release, excision of arteriovenous malformations, free flap reconstruction and cross-facial nerve reinnervation. During my time in theatre I was able to practice basic suturing and observed more complex techniques including microsurgery. Overall, this experience gave me excellent exposure to paediatric plastic surgery and insight into rare/syndromic conditions in children that only the most specialist centres see. I was also able to shadow leading experts in the field, including Clinical Professors who helped to pioneer surgical techniques in craniofacial surgery, particularly for craniosynostosis.
