Please give an overview of what you saw / did (200 words max)	I spent 6 weeks in the Plastic Surgery Department at Addenbrooke's Hospital as part of the University of Cambridge elective programme. I was given a suggested weekly timetable; however this was very flexible and I was free to attend theatre lists or clinics provided I let the team know in advance.
	I shadowed trainees during on-call shifts and patient assessments in the plastic surgery unit, and was able to get a great deal of experience in theatre as well as in the minor operations clinic. I scrubbed in and assisted with numerous surgeries during the placement and saw a wide variety of procedures—ranging from skin cancer excisions to hand surgery through to major trauma and free-flap reconstructions.
	The department is very friendly and several of the registrars were quite happy for me to get hands-on during surgical cases. I was able to practice my suturing skills, and even excised a couple of skin lesions and performed a tendon repair under supervision.
	I've also had the opportunity to get started on a couple of research projects stemming from the elective—one focused on evaluating a breast reconstruction technique, and another on developing simulation models for surgical skills education.

There are often three theatre lists running simultaneously and I was always able to find something interesting going on to get involved with.

Would you recommend this to someone else? (explain if necessary)	Absolutely—this elective was a fantastic opportunity that gave me a great deal of exposure to plastic surgery as a specialty as well as several opportunities to start developing my portfolio for future applications.
