Please give an overview of what you saw / did (200 words max)	I was in the operating theatres across different hospitals, assisting in different procedures, ranging from reconstructive surgery to aesthetic surgery, including simple removal of gastrostomy tube scars, taking out breast implants, liposuction, blepharoplasties, correcting gynaecomastia, breast reconstruction using DIEP or LAT flaps, which involved microsurgery. I was given hands-on experience suturing under the guidance of the surgeons and to sit in on various different consultations – from pre and post-operative for breast reconstruction for breast cancer, blepharoplasties, ptosis, botox, etc. I also visited patients post-op to check on the viability of the flaps.
What were the best things about the visit? (120 words max)	The variety of different procedures that a qualified plastic surgeon could perform was astounding. Comparing between the NHS and an insurance-based healthcare system also highlighted the pros and cons of universal healthcare coverage. The healthcare team and everyone in the country were extremely warm and welcoming. I was well integrated into the team and was given plenty of opportunities to practice vital surgical techniques and room to ask questions without judgement.
What problems did you encounter? (120 words max)	The only disadvantage was the language barrier. I was not able to ask more complex questions, and this impacted the patient-physician interaction slightly.
